Bohmer's recently teamed up with SALT – an organisation which is rapidly



expanding in reputation and operations for all it does to support and link tradeswomen across the country, to be part of the conversation regarding encouraging more women to enter trades, whilst improving working conditions and recognising women of all ages who are highly skilled.
